Our next production: Love, Love, Love

It is wonderful to be back in the swing of creating theatre at the Sewell Barn again - and *Love, Love, Love* is certainly keeping us all on our toes! In three acts it takes us from 1967 to 1990 and finally lands us in 2011, the year the play was first performed.

All this time travelling presents our cast of five with the challenge of age-blind acting. Jonathan Redding and Ayshea Christian take the lead roles as the rebellious student couple, Kenneth and Sandra, both aged 19 in Act 1, with Kevin Oelrichs joining them as Kenneth's 23 year old brother, Henry. In Act 2 they have settled into conventional middle class life and we meet their two teenage children, Rose (Emma Kirkham) and Jamie (Jose Tarouca). Act 3 brings us more up to date with our actors able to play closer to their ages.

Set designer and builder Phil Williamson has had the task of creating three different sets including making a working 1960s TV which turns into a 1990s TV in Act 2! We've also had to source a 60s record player, a cassette player and an iPod and dock. Rehearsals have included lively discussions on baby boomers versus generation X, parental responsibility and idealism versus practicality.

Love, Love, Love is sharp and funny, its characters and ideas are abrasive and challenging. You may find, as we have done, that you don't always agree with them, but we hope, as you journey through the concerns of the late twentieth century and into the twenty-first, that you not only enjoy the ride but also that your post show discussions will be as stimulating as ours.

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Audition notice: Woman in Mind

Premiered in Scarborough in 1985 and drawing upon autobiographical experiences, Ayckbourn's work centres on Susan, a middle-aged wife and mother who has devoted much time and emotional energy to her marriage and family. Her efforts, however, have failed to bring her happiness and satisfaction; in fact, she has been left feeling undervalued

and unappreciated by her family members who treat her with both condescension and some disdain. She is, in effect, trapped in relationships that, in the end, will overwhelm and destroy her. In order to cope with her increasingly desperate situation, Susan has created in her mind a fantasy family that dresses in white, quaffs champagne at every opportunity, lives in a stately home and who adores and respects her.

As her level of disillusionment increases, Susan turns more and more to her family of the imagination but, crucially, is less able to control the characters she has created for herself. It is the blurring of the worlds of fantasy and reality that will ultimately have dire consequences for her. From the outset of the play, when Susan comes to after being knocked unconscious by accidentally standing on a garden rake, all the things that happen are seen and heard from her perspective: the audience are compelled to look at the world through the eyes of a woman whose mental health is failing.



New season: capacity, ticket prices and booking

We have decided, due to the continuing uncertainty of the pandemic, to limit our audience sizes. For the time being, therefore, **ticket sales will be capped at a maximum of 60 per performance** (our normal maximum is 100). As such, advance booking is highly recommended to avoid disappointment.

We haven't put up our ticket prices since 2018. With increasing costs – not to mention the loss of income, for obvious reasons, in the last two years – we have made a small increase to our prices for the 2021/22 season: **£11 for standard tickets, £10 for concessions**. This is an increase of just £1 per ticket; however, please note that the actual benefit to the Barn will only be in the region of 20p, as we have decided to absorb all booking fee costs – so you will now only pay the above rates, whether booking online or by telephone. If you'd like to support us further, there's the option on TicketSource for an extra donation.

For our forthcoming 2021-22 season, we need to recruit more operators and programmers/riggers to the 'box'. Our technical co-ordinator, Chris Jones, does a wonderful job of programming and designing, using our QLab software and our new LED lights; but as we move (hopefully) back to several shows each year, and eight performances plus tech and dress for each show, we need to spread the load. Front of House

For our new season, the role of FOH will be particularly important. We are still maintaining a reduced audience size and paying close attention to COVID measures, and the staff that welcome our public are vital in this.
