Our next production: A Midsummer Night's Dream

by William Shakespeare | directed by Clare Williamson 1-3 & 7-10 June at 7:30; matinee on 10 June at 2:30

In A Midsummer Night's Dream we see what happens when reality and magic collide on midsummer night when, traditionally, the natural order of the world is allowed to turn upside down before it is righted again in the morning. The *Dream* is Shakespeare's most performed play for good reason – it is hilariously funny, it can be enjoyed by all ages, and many quotations of its well-known characters are deeply embedded in the English language.

The Dream is also open to interpretation on many levels. Fundamentally, it is rather weird: "A bunch of insane fairies attempt to solve the romantic problems of some mortals lost in a wood" (John Haynes/Time Out). Yet the play can also be considered as a prototype of feminism, the first dramatic example of young women rebelling against patriarchal authority.

The director of this production, Clare Williamson, has embraced the *Dream*'s multi-layered challenges of theatrical delusions and illusions: "Not only is this a joyous play for an audience to watch, it's also a wonderful play to direct. That is because it is so open to possibilities, with so many opportunities for the team of wardrobe, set design, lighting and sound to create our own version of this magical world. And what fun it is for the actors, with such a rich cast of characters to get their teeth into!"

The 21 speaking roles are played by 13 actors, with a highly-talented combination of Barn regulars and newcomers. As was the case in Shakespeare's original troupe of players, several double-up between 'foolish mortals' and denizens of the fantasy world. Sean Bennett and Netta Jones play the leaders of both realms, Theseus and Hippolyta as well as Oberon and Titania; Robin Croft plays Philostrate and Puck; Barney Matley plays Egeus and Quince; whilst Alexandra Evans, Melanie Peter, Megan Saunders and Lewis Garvey are both the other 'rude mechanicals' and fairies. In single roles, Rob Tiffen plays Bottom, with Naomi Cunningham, Eva Wright, Zach Burbridge and Jose Tarouca as the young lovers, Hermia, Helena, Demetrius and Lysander. There are also special guest appearances by Olivia and Lyra Matley.
